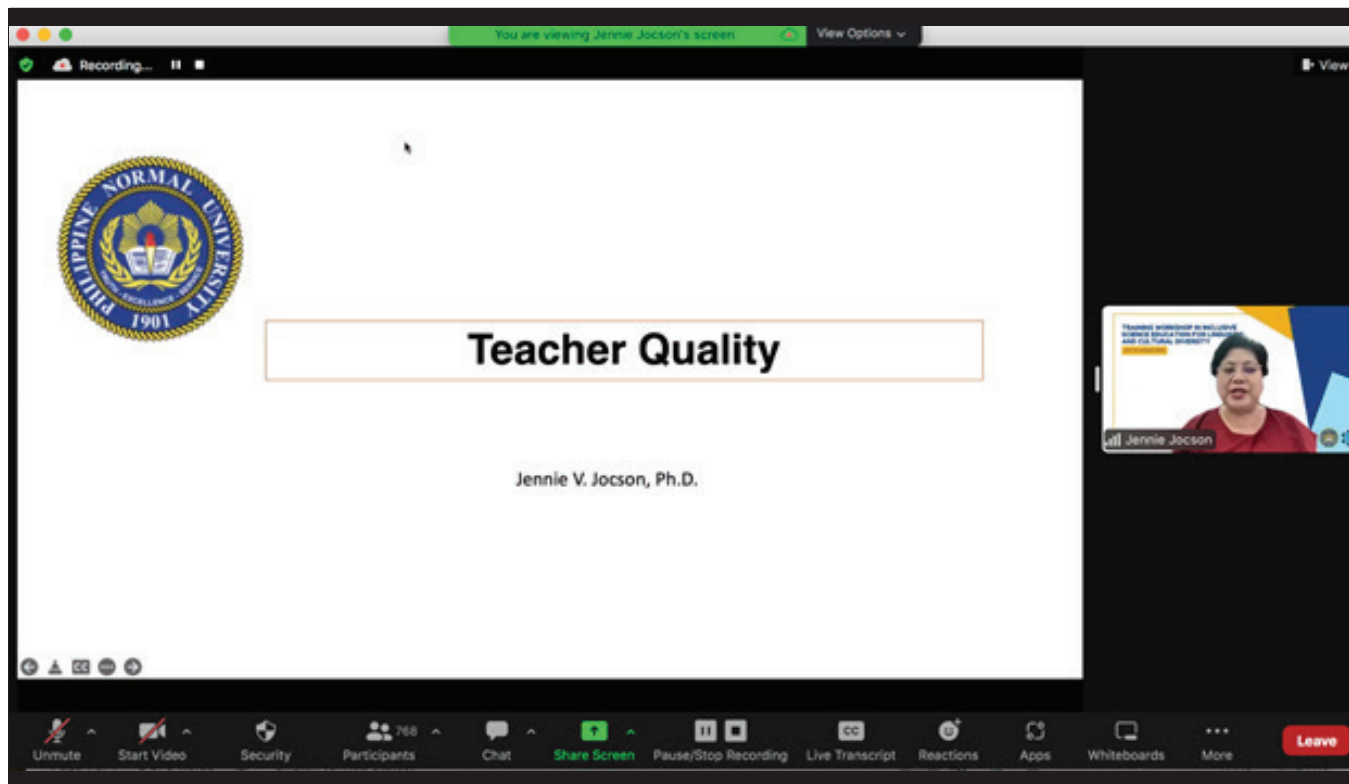




▲ Dr. Jennie V. Jocson (Vice President for Academics) discusses teacher quality as keynote speaker

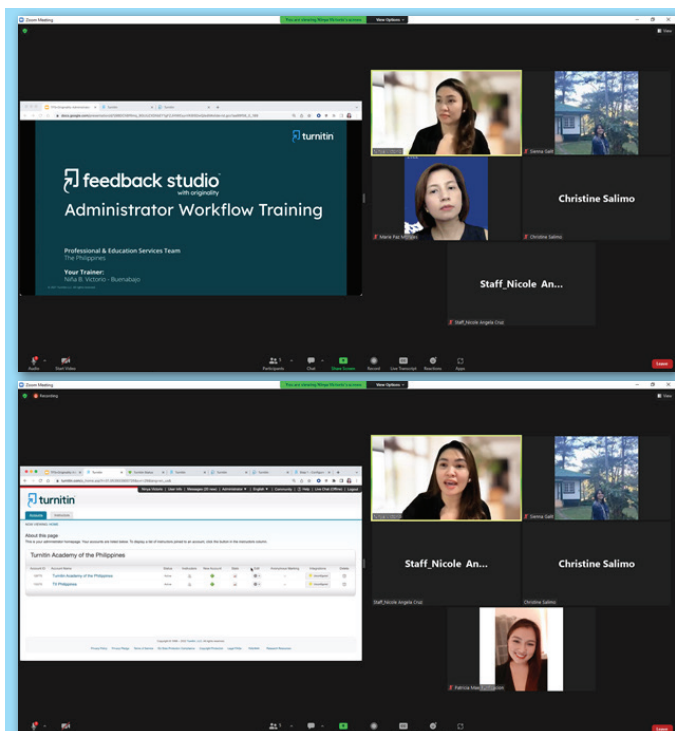
University in Georgia), and Dr. Lydia S. Roleda and Dr. Rochelle Irene G. Lucas (ESTA-DLSU team).

The activity comprised two phases that capacitated selected 1000 science teachers on the research team-developed framework, Science Education for Linguistic and Cultural Diversity in Philippine Public Higher Education (SELC-PhPHiEd) and the objectives of the projects with its major concepts and expected results. The second phase was designed to mentor selected 100 participants from the original number who were assigned to ESTA-PNU mentors for the development of Lesson Exemplars (LEs) inclusive of hook videos

(a two-minute catchy video on a science concept conceptualized by the team using the Predict-Observe-Explain strategy). These two products were the major outputs of the activity that opened the opportunity to develop an online repository, ESTA Open Educational Resource, which gives free access to a wide audience across the country.

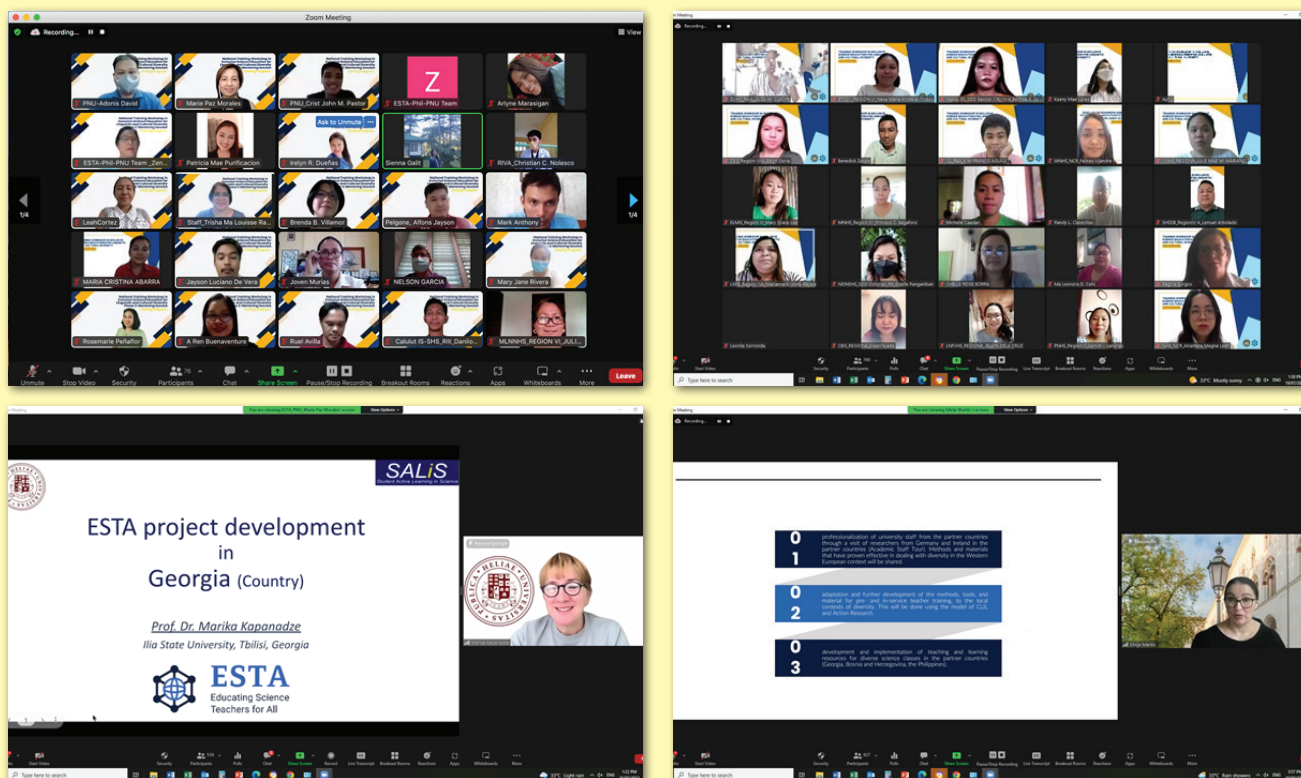


▲ PNU-PO Team as participants of Administrator's Training with Ms. Victorio-Buenabajo (Consultant from Turnitin-Philippines)

PO publishes APHERJ 9(1)

The Publication Office published the Asia Pacific Higher Education Research Journal (APHERJ) Volume 9 Issue 1 on August 31, 2022. The current issue features four (4) articles that highlights the significance of developing programs and instruments, investigating learning interventions, and identifying experiences of learners amid the crisis in pursuing quality education. Using comparative literature review, Tabalanza and colleagues (2022) investigated the relevance and usefulness of socio-emotional learning (SEL) in both pre-pandemic and post-pandemic periods. Likewise, Ole and Gallos (2022) suggested the utilization of Feedback Loop Model (FLD) as a

Professional Development Program (PDP) to improve teachers' classroom practices. The reported experiences of learners and teachers on Foreign Language (FL) in the new normal setting unfolded the dire need to address issues in virtual management classrooms as described in the study of Ledesma and Toledo (2022). Lastly, Jemmy (2022) developed an Educational Research Literacy Scale (ERLS) that measures four dimensions (*knowledge of research concepts, data literacy, information literacy, and evidence-based reasoning*) of Filipino professionals, which may be adopted by the higher education institutions. ■

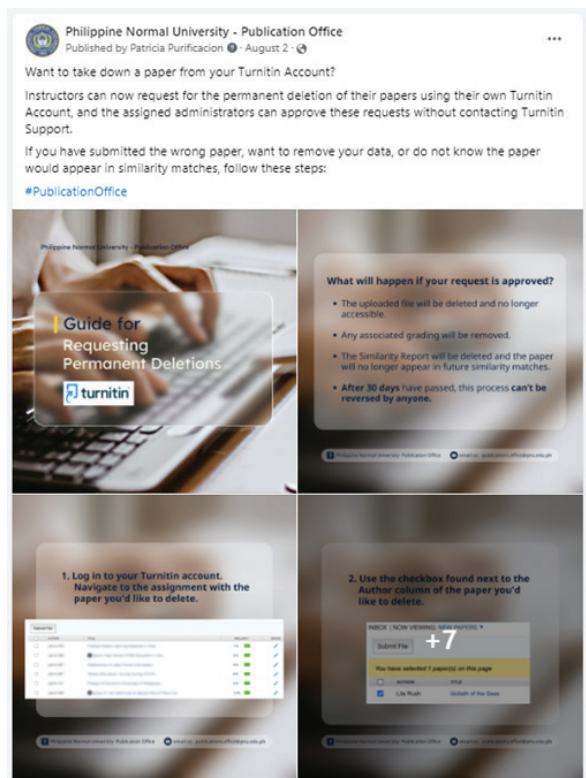

PO launches Guide for Requesting Permanent Deletions in Turnitin

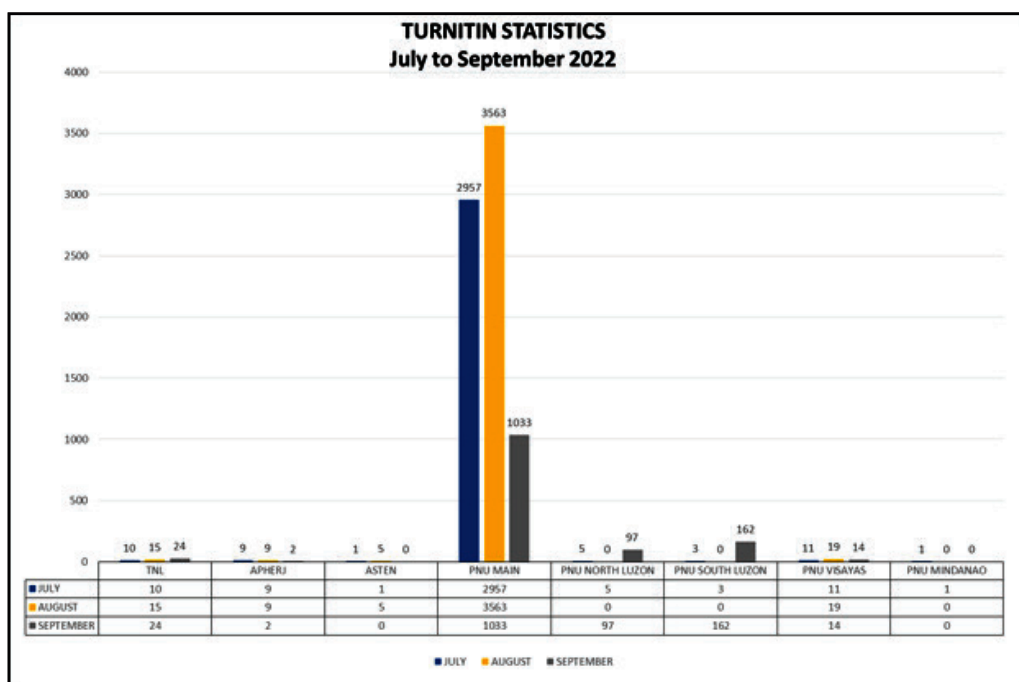


Paper deletion requests are now entirely self-managed within institutions using the new automated paper deletion workflow. Recently, Turnitin provided a process that allows institutions to take control of the data privacy of their own Turnitin accounts without ever having to contact Turnitin. The new process of paper deletion replaced the manual multistep process that institutions previously followed (requesting deletions through Turnitin Support). The new automated procedure enables the administrators to

quickly and efficiently delete institutional papers from within their own Turnitin administrator account.

To guide the PNU faculty in facilitating the deletion requests, the administrator of Turnitin for PNU (Publication Office) released a guide on how to process paper deletions. The document, published in [PO Facebook Page](#) and [PO Research Portal](#) on August 2, 2022, contains guidelines on how PNU faculty members can delete submitted documents that are stored within the PNU repository. ■
